### **Panel Discussion**

Political actors frequently emphasize the relevance of Central Asia in foreign policy. At the same time, institutions like the Institute for Asian and African Studies at Humboldt University are constantly struggling with budget cuts, a possible indicator for a lack of acknowledgement of their social and political relevance. As master and PhD students of the field, we believe that our research could be truly valuable for the development of new strategies in foreign policy. What are the challenges in this cooperation?
