Dissertation: „A grammatical description of Ts'ixa (Kalahari Khoe): Tense and aspect”

Ts'ixa is a highly endangered language, spoken by less than 200 individuals in the remote village of Mababe in northeastern Botswana. It is yet to be determined whether Ts'ixa bears closer affinities to the Shua dialect cluster in the east, or to the Kxoe dialect cluster in the west. Structural properties of the Ts'ixa tense-aspect system resemble Shua in that they include use of both pre-verbal particles and post-verbal affixes. The latter are attached to the verb stem via a so-called juncture-morpheme which is found throughout the Kalahari Khoe group. This presentation will discuss some features of the tense-aspect system of Ts'ixa, with special emphasis on the distribution of tense-aspect markers in texts collected during fieldwork in 2013.
