



Scientific project collaboration for provenance research Collection from colonial contexts

The Museum Burg Mylau is an institution of futurum vogtland e. V. and is one of the most important museums in the border region of Saxony, Thuringia, Bavaria and Bohemia. More than 100 years of collecting activity have created a very heterogeneous collection with a heavy focus on natural history, regional, economic and castle history and geology. A smaller part of the collection originates from colonial contexts and is now in the Museum Burg Mylau and in the State Ethnographic Collections in Dresden.

For the collaboration in the research project "History and Provenance of the Ethnological Collection Mylau and Reichenbach in the Museum Burg Mylau", funded by the German Lost Art Foundation, we are offering the following position. The provenance research project deals exclusively with the objects in the historical collection that originated in Africa. The regions of origin of the 180 objects currently in the collection are concentrated in western and southern Africa, focusing on the former German colonies.

These are your tasks:

- Establishing contacts in the regions of origin and leading the scientific exchange for the formation of a scientific network for the research of the objects currently located in Mylau and Dresden.
- Editing data sets for the publication of objects in the museum portal museum.digital
- Participation in the project team including written documentation of the results of the work as part of the final report.
- If necessary, reassignment of previously unresolved collection objects to the collection holdings with the provenance of Africa.
