

(2) Prosodic shape: Reduplication of bimoraic base; same tonal pattern

(3) Morphosyntax: intransitive (state) vs. transitive (action)

Food texture verbs in Glui

(3) Morphosyntax: intransitive (state) vs. transitive (action)

'to have the texture of under-cooked caterpillar'

'to eat feeling the texture of under-cooked caterpillar'

(4) Morphophonology: reduplication, tonal alternation, consonant alternation, and bimoraicization

Ideophone /!ūp/ 'sound of crushing an undercooked caterpillar in the mouth'

1 Consonant alternation & bimoraicization

!um

2 Reduplication !um-!um

3 Tonal placement [!úm-!úm] (intransitive-state) [!úm-!ūm] (transitive-action)

Note:

(1) Segmental alternation in the second mora.

(2) Additional mora, allowing for tonal placement.

(3) Adjustment of rhythmic structure.







Three sound symbolic domains




Three sound symbolic domains



imitation of rhythmic sound & movement of mastication


Three sound symbolic domains
