MAKING SENSE OF HOMELESSNESS AND HOMEMAKING IN NUSAYBIN, TURKEY (2015-2023)

The presentation is based on the preliminary field data of the ongoing project "Making Sense of Homelessness and Homemaking in the Context of Conflict-Induced Displacement: A Feminist Perspective on Sur, Nusaybin and Berlin 2015-21". Based on the narratives of the internally displaced people (IDP) in Nusaybin, the first part of the presentation will focus on the conflicts of homelessness and homemaking practices of the IDP who have forcedly left their homes after the armed conflicts that had taken place between the YPS (Yekineyen Parastina Sivil - Civil Defense Units) and Turkish security forces between the years 2015 and 2016 in the city of Nusaybin by particularly focusing on female IDP's conflicts and empowerment mechanisms between the years 2016-2020. The second part will make a comparison between the homelessness and homemaking experiences of the IDP in Sur, Diyarbakır and in Nusaybin.
