"Buddhism in Mongolia Today"

For centuries (13-14th cent., 16-20th cent.) Buddhism in Mongolia played an important role shaping Mongolian worldview and culture. The revolution of 1921 disrupted this development and caused nearly complete destruction of Buddhism. The talk will focus on the aftermath: it will describe Buddhist revitalization since 1990. There are some features of Buddhist practices in Mongolia, which stem from the past, such as the division into "yellow" and "red" traditions. However, certain aspects of the revitalized Buddhism in Mongolia are new phenomena, such as foundation of nunneries, establishment of the Western style Dharma centers, new ways of Buddhist social engagement and the impact of market economy. Moreover, the role of Buddhist leaders, Tibetan aid, Mongolian national identity, a plurality of religions and several other factors, which influence Buddhism in Mongolia today, will be discussed.

Agata Bareja-Starzyńska is a Mongolist and Tibetologist, and Head of the Department of Turkish Studies and Inner Asian Peoples of the Faculty of Oriental Studies at the University of Warsaw, Poland. She graduated (MA) from the University of Warsaw in 1988, and obtained her Ph.D. in Humanities in 1999 in Oriental Studies with a specialization in Mongolian Studies at the University of Warsaw. She finished her habilitation in 2017 in literature. Her scholarly interests focus on Buddhism in Mongolia and Tibet, Mongolian-Tibetan relations, and Mongolian and Tibetan literature.
