Pashto Language Course – د پښتو لوست

The Central Asian Seminar at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin is offering a **Pashto language course** in the **summer semester 2025**, open to participants from outside the university. The course will be conducted in a **hybrid format**, allowing both in-person and online participation. Face-to-face sessions in Berlin will be streamed live via **Zoom**, enabling remote participants to engage **actively** rather than just passively.

Course Details

- No prior knowledge of Pashto is required.
- Language of instruction: English.
- Schedule: Wednesdays & Fridays, 08:00–10:00 CEST (April 21 July 19, 2025).
- Mode: Hybrid (in-person in Berlin & online via Zoom).

In subsequent semesters, **Pashto II, III, and IV** and, possibly, a **reading course for advanced students** will be offered. Since **Pashto I only provides an introduction**, it is strongly recommended that participants plan to continue with the following courses to build proficiency. Due to the **complex structure of Pashto**, ongoing study is essential for deeper language acquisition.

The course follows a **communication-oriented** approach, developing both **active and passive** language skills from the very beginning. **Audio and video materials** will be provided to reinforce learning and aid retention.

Participants who are not enrolled at Humboldt-Universität can register as **guest auditors** or **visiting students**.
