The workshop "From Kaithi to Canon: Writing and Power in South Asia and beyond" offers students an interdisciplinary space to discuss writing, power, and identity. Together, we will read and discuss texts, watch a documentary on the Kaithi script, listen to a guest lecture, and conclude with a creative "show and tell."
