Course Description

Post-colonial states in the Southeast Asian region have been described as being strongly oriented towards the future, prointizing modemization and development. In recent years however, the past seems to have taken on a renewed relevance. This intensive two-week course brings experts from Berlin, Penang and Yogukarta toggether to discuss memory and its transmission as a social, cultural and political phenomenon. With reference to both the European and Southeast Asian experience, hegemonic state-centred narratives about the past are compared with bottom-up popular memories to understand how multipic identities are formed, contexted and modified.

Structure of the Summer School

The summer school will be held in Block seminar format and will run over two weeks. During the first week, lecturers of various disciplinary backgrounds (history, political science, anthropology) will introduce students to some of the main theories on memory and heritage and give them insights into important research that has been done on these issues in Southesst Asia and Europe (with a particular focus on Germany). Participants will be expected to read the assigned interactive beforehand and will be encouraged to interact with Fellow students from Universitas Gadjah Mada and Universitä Sams Malaysia throughout the duration of the program. In the second week, participants will form small research groups and will be assigned different memory sites located in Berlin. These groups will then conduct mini-research projects, speaking with people connected to their assigned site. Groups will present their findings on the final day of the summer school.

Applications

This course is primarily open to students enrolled in the Modern South and Southeast Asian Studies Master's program but students from other HU Berlin M.A. programs are also invited to apply to the summer school.

Applications should include a CV and a short letter of motivation that also indicates the student's main fields of interest, and be sent (as one single PDF document) to the following email address no later than the <u>30⁶ of June</u>, 2016;
